CHIEF MASTER SERGEANT COLLIN J. BAULCH

Chief Master Sergeant Collin J. Baulch is the Chief Enlisted Manager, Air Force Operational Test and Evaluation Center, Kirtland Air Force Base, N.M. As the Chief Enlisted Manager, Chief Baulch ensures personnel programs are in place to enhance the morale, health and welfare for more than 675 personnel assigned to headquarters, five major detachments covering 18 geographically separated operating locations across the nation. In addition to monitoring morale, he articulates the commander's vision and policies and communicates the concerns of the enlisted force to the commander. He also advises senior leadership on manpower, personnel, and professional development issues affecting 45 enlisted career fields in support of operational test and evaluation of 90 major acquisition programs valued at more than \$933 billion.



Chief Master Sergeant Baulch was raised in Sheboygan, Wisconsin and entered the Air Force in January 1998 as a Munitions Systems Apprentice. During his career, he has held various leadership roles within the Munitions Management career field at section level through squadron or directorate level. His assignments include bases in Japan, Republic of Korea, Iceland, Alaska, Utah, Illinois and Italy. With his time with the Afloat Prepositioned Fleet program, he supported War Reserve and Combat Sustainment to Diego Garcia, Republic of Korea, 83rd Ordnance Battalion (Japan), Okinawa, Guam, and the Military Ocean Terminals in Concord and Sunny Point. Additionally, Chief Master Sergeant Baulch has deployed to Iraq in support of Operation IRAQI FREEDOM and twice to Qatar in support of Operations INHERENT RESOLVE, FREEDOM SENTINEL, RESOLUTE SUPPORT and the Combined Joint Task Force - Horn of Africa.
